PARENT PORTAL

The Parent Portal has been up and running for a year now. Junior classes have used it for viewing the homework for the week. Parents can use it to keep track of attendance and of monies paid in to the school and for viewing end of year school reports.

E PAYMENTS

The school is currently setting up a new e-payment system whereby parents will be able to pay all monies to the school electronically (e.g. School Maintenance Fund, school tours, swimming lessons etc). will be up and running in September and we would encourage all parents to use this facility. It will hopefully make paying easier for parents and it will make accounting more straightforward for the school.

PARENTS ASSOCIATION

There is huge credit due to the fantastic work and fundraising done by the Parents Association this year. Children will gain from the massive investment of over €16,000 and will have the opportunity to engage in coding, designing, problem solving and critical thinking activities with the purchase of 18 i-pads, 18 Lego WeDo 2.0 kits, 12 Sphero packs with mats, 12 Bee-bots and associated accessories. This

will be launched in September with the help of Wriggle (authorised Apple reseller). The Wriggle Roadcaster will be sent to our school on the 21st of September where the children will be able to board the bus to see robotics in action.

The Parents Association are also funding activities for Active Schools Week such as Yoga, Zumba and transport to and from the orienteering in Ballybeg Woods.



In addition, our fantastic library facility would not be so wonderful but for the continued support and funding provided by the Parents Association and the library volunteers who maintain this fantastic resource in our school. Sincere thanks to the parents who make all of this possible.

We know that we are very fortunate to have such an active and supportive Parents Association who constantly work to enhance the provision of education for all pupils in the school. In order for this to be sustained, new volunteers are always needed.

ACCELERATED READER

The Accelerated Reader Programme continues to prove itself as a powerful tool for motivating our students to read for pleasure and for monitoring and managing independent reading practice.

To date this year, pupils from First to Sixth Class have read in the region of 10,500 books which totals to approximately 120 million words!

GREEN SCHOOLS

Clarecastle NS is in the process of applying for their sixth Green Schools' Flag based on the theme Global Citizenship- Litter and Waste. This school maintenance theme affords the students the opportunity to discover how the Green Schools work influences people and environments worldwide; while also revising litter and waste management.



The overall aim is to create a knowledge and understanding about the link between environmental degradation and human rights. It is a two year process which concludes in March 2019.

The new committee, formed in September 2017 consists of students from 1st to 6th class. The students meet once a month to discuss and plan upcoming events, conduct surveys and monitor our waste management. Compost waste and recyclable paper/plastic is collected from the classrooms on a daily basis. Litter picking occurs in the grounds school weekly. Students are encouraged to bring in old batteries and old phones from home so that they can be recycled in a controlled manner. Bird tables and feeders were set up during the winter months to our vulnerable look after feathered friends. A wild garden was set up in the school grounds in March to complement our Bug Hotel and we are currently observing natural wild flowers growing there.



A 'Spring Clean' of the local environs occurred in April and all students participated.

Junior Infants to Second Class engaged in scooter training and Fifth Class students engaged in bicycle training.



During the months of May and June, pupils were encouraged to walk or to cycle to school or to park 'n' stride each Wednesday as part of the WOW initiative. The National Walk to School Week in May returned high student participation and we achieved a similar result during the National Cycle to School Week from June 11th to 15th. Sixth Class children enjoyed a cycle to Ennis and participated in a 4km cycle tour of Ennis on National COW Day, Wednesday June 13th. They were cheered on and waved off by other classes as they left the school.



In early June, Third and Fourth Class children had the opportunity to take part in a recycling workshop. They sorted waste packaging into the correct bins and learned all about the new household recycling list. Children were informed about a competition to make a bin lorry from recycled materials and many boys and girls are now working on this project. There is still time left to enter for those who would like to do so!

We wish to take this opportunity to thank all for their continued support and look forward to completing our application for the sixth Green Flag with more concentrated projects in the new school year.
