5th GREEN FLAG AWARDED TO CLARECASTLE NATIONAL SCHOOL

For many years our school has been involved in the **National Green Schools Programme** which is part of an international environmental education programme and award scheme known as Eco-Schools.



It is designed to raise students' awareness of environmental and sustainable development issues through classroom study. Schools are required to undertake a particular theme for each flag and to devise and implement a two year action plan coordinated by a school committee and involving all students and teachers from the school.



The theme for the 5th Green Flag is **Biodiversity**, the variety of plant and animal life and the study of our local ecosystems. Many projects were undertaken including 'Feeding the birds', monitoring and surveying the birds frequenting our school yard, setting up a bug hotel, a wild garden, school trips to our local rivers and woodlands, planting trees and shrubs and various workshops.

The school also had to revisit and maintain the previous four themes (1) Litter & Waste (2) Energy (3) Water and (4) Travel.

In March we were visited by a representative from **An Taisce** to our school and thereafter we were delighted to be awarded our 5th Green Flag. In order to celebrate this great achievement we hope to raise the flag on **June 20th at approx 1.00 p.m**.

We are extending a warm invitation to all to attend this event and to join us for a cup of tea, a biscuit and a chat afterwards. Thanking you, The Green School's Committee.

PARENT PORTAL

Next August we will be rolling out the Parent Portal element of our school's Pupil Management System, Aladdin. This will be the primary means by which information will be circulated by the school. The Parent Portal will further enhance the school's communication with parents and will enable parents to stay informed about and connected with their child's education and learning.

E PAYMENTS

In August 2018 we hope to be in position to commence а receiving electronic payments from parents. The Ε Payment system will facilitate the easier payment of school collections money for parent/guardians and reduce the amount of cash and cheques being sent into our school in line recent with central bank directives. Updates will be issued next year.



INTERNET SAFETY TALK

The Parents' Association organised Dr. Maureen Griffin, Forensic Psychologist, to talk to pupils from third to sixth on the topic of internet safety. These talks proved to be very informative for and beneficial to the pupils. I asked Dr. Griffin for feedback from the day in order to be able to inform parents of potential areas of concern.

The following are a list of concerns Dr. Griffin raised based on her interactions with the pupils in our school!!!!!!

1. Students using age inappropriate apps and sites (e.g. Instagram, Musical.ly and Snapchat -all of which are rated 13+)

2. Students are lying about their age online with some pretending to be over 18 years. This increases the risks children face online.

3. Students are using the main Youtube site instead of Youtube kids, which is designed for children under 13 years. This is particularly relevant for 3rd and 4th class students.

4. Students playing 16+ and 18+ first person shooter games such as the Call of Duty series, the Grand Theft Auto Series etc. These games are completely age inappropriate for children at primary school age. Parents should check the pegi rating system http://www.pegi.info/ie/

5. Students having technology in the bedroom at night-time. Numerous campaigns have demonstrated the negative effects of having technology in the bedroom (e.g. Safefood, National Sleep Foundation, World Health Organisation)

6. Students having password protected devices where parents do not know the password and students download apps onto devices without parental supervision. Parents should have the password to download all

apps and should be checking apps before they are installed to make sure you know the features and whether or not it is age appropriate. Common sense media <u>https://www.commonsens</u> <u>emedia.org/</u> is a great resource for checking out games, apps, sites etc.

ACCELERATED READER

The Accelerated Reader Programme which is funded by the Parents Association continues to go from strength to strength with 99% of pupils from 1^{st} to 6^{th} class engaging with the programme this year.

Last year, as always, we were very proud of all the boys and girls when they read over 9300 books totalling in excess of 111 million words. Believe it or not they have improved on that!!!!!



To date pupils from 1st to 6th have read **12,500 books** totalling in the region of **130 million** words!!! That is a massive 3200 more books and 19 million more words than last year!!!!!

Our fantastic library facility would not be the way it is only

for the continued support and funding provided by our wonderful Parents Association and the library volunteers who maintain this fantastic resource in our school.

SCHOOL CHOIR


Clarecastle School Choir has had another great year, having had many opportunities to showcase the hard work of this very talented group of children.
