## **GREEN SCHOOLS**



The Green Schools Committee are continuing their work on the reduction and recycling of waste at school by encouraging pupils and staff to segregate paper, batteries, tetra-pack containers and fruit waste in the correct bins. The committee recently carried out a survey on pupil understanding of Climate

Change and what can be done in order to make a positive impact. Together with the Clarecastle Community Development Project, the committee recently organised a biodiversity outing for Fifth and Sixth Class pupils. The children met with Mary archaeologist Dillon. and heritage expert, who is working conjunction with Community Development Group to help develop and improve the diversity of plants and animals in the People's Park. Children were engaged in formulating ideas and plans for improving park and Mary will communicate the ideas back to the group, with the view to implementing some of these ideas.

#### CYCLE TRAINING

The Green Schools Committee recently organised Cycle Training for Fifth Class pupils. This was provided by 'Cycle Right' and is funded by An Taisce, Clare County Council and the Parents Association.



Cycle Right is the National Standard for Cycle Training. It is an inclusive programme and provides practical cycle safety and skills training to promote competent and confident cyclists. Pupils enjoyed cycling their bikes in the school yard on Tuesday 10<sup>th</sup> March which was their first training session. This has proven in past years to be a great opportunity to build cycling confidence in a safe environment and to develop competence in road cycling.

#### SCHOOL CHOIR

They performed a variety of songs in a group of about 1,000 children and were accompanied by a full symphony youth orchestra.
