NATIONAL AWARD IN INTEL MINI-SCIENTIST COMPETITION

Three Fifth Class students achieved wonderful success at the Intel Mini Scientist Grand Final which was held on Tuesday March 5th in Maynooth University.



Addison Clara Powell, O'Loughlin and Freya Starr Amran were awarded the 'Most Innovative Idea' Award with their project 'The Solar Powered Car'. The girls demonstrated how solar power works by making a solar powered car. They qualified to bring their project to the Grand Final in December. In each round of the competition, Freya, Clara and Addison exhibited their project which included a visual display, project book and demonstration of their solar powered car for a panel of judges.



The entire school community are very proud of the girls' achievement as almost 8,000

students from 120 schools in 18 counties across Ireland took part in the competition since last September. The Grand Final brought together the top 23 projects from across the country and was filled with innovative and imaginative projects, put together through months of hard work. The judges, after a very difficult task of deliberation, selected the winning projects. The hard work and commitment shown by Addison, Freya and Clara was praised by the judges in each round of the competition and led to their wonderful achievement.

VISIT FROM MINISTER JIM DALY TD

On February 12th, Jim Daly TD and Minister of State at the Department of Health visited the school. He was joined by Mr Joe Carey, TD and by Councillor Paul Murphy.

Having been made aware of the Internet and Technology Agreement, which provides guidelines on best practice on the use of technology by children and gives resources to parents to help monitor and secure their child's use of technology, by his cabinet colleague, Joe Carey TD, he decided to visit the school to further discuss the agreement and to address pupils in the school. He was welcomed to the school by the Student Council. The Trad Group enhanced the welcome with some lovely

tunes. He then proceeded to the School Library where members of the Learning Squads demonstrated some of the technological equipment being used throughout the school. Members of the Board of Management joined parents, staff and children from Third to Sixth Class in the School Hall to hear Minister Daly praise the initiative and the foresightedness of the school and of the Board of Management with the guidance and assistance of Dr Maureen Griffin, Forensic Psychologist and Director of MGMS Training Ltd. in devising the Agreement.



He also sought permission from Mr Moloney to bring the Internet and Technology Use Agreement to the attention of an interdepartmental working with group, the view to implementing similar agreements schools in throughout the country.

His visit was completed with a performance by the School Choir. Minister Daly thanked and praised the children for their wonderful performances and for the warm welcome shown to him.

CYCLE TRAINING

Pupils had the pleasure of taking to their bikes in the school yard on Thursdays for four weeks. The final session involved a supervised cycle whereby groups left the school grounds via the People's Park and came back to school on the road.

It was a great opportunity to build cycling confidence in a safe environment and to develop competence in road cycling.

POLLINATOR WORKSHOP

Fifth Class pupils also had the pleasure of attending a Pollinator Workshop in the school grounds. This was organised by the Green Schools Committee and was provided by Irish Seed Savers Association.



They learned all about the importance of pollination in the lifecycle of plants. They observed a map of the school grounds and discussed areas within the school grounds where additional plants could be sown to aid pollination.

The Green Schools Committee travelled to Irish Seed Savers in Scariff on April 4th. They had the opportunity to see the organic seed gardens and the heritage orchards. Activities on the day included seed sowing, a treasure and plant hunt, plant identification and a woodland trail. A most enjoyable time was had by all.

INCREDIBLE EDIBLES

The Green Schools Committee registered the school for the Agri Aware Incredible Edibles initiative. This is a healthy eating programme for Primary School pupils and encourages schools across the country to get busy growing carrots, lettuce, potatoes, strawberries, turnips, spinach and herbs.



Schools are supplied with a grow pack which contains everything necessary to grow a feast of healthy foods.

Third Class will focus on the initiative and have visited the Community Garden to sow a variety of vegetables. They will be caring for the food produce in the coming months. Children in Senior Infants and First Class have also been busy sowing fruit and vegetables recently. All children will have the chance to observe these fruits and vegetables growing in the coming months. There might even be a chance for them to

cook and taste the fruits of the work!
