GREEN SCHOOLS NATIONAL SPRING CLEAN

The Green School Committee is encouraging everybody in Clarecastle to support the National Spring Clean initiative and to actively participate in the cleaning up of litter in their own environment.

This year is the 21st year of the nationally organised campaign and the first time that people are faced with following Covid-19 precautions during the clean-up. The initiative helps to heighten awareness of litter and waste issues, promotes personal responsibility for keeping the environment litter free and motivates people to recycle and reuse where possible.

Our school usually organises a Spring Clean Up but due to the Covid restrictions, we cannot do so this year. Therefore, we are inviting families to keep their immediate areas clear of litter by making a concentrated effort to clean up their local environment. During the Easter Holiday, a commitment to spending two minutes picking litter each time one goes out would have a big impact on the local area and it would be a small but significant act of community service.



The following Covid-19 precautions must be adhered to when carrying out a clean-up: -

- -Only do so with your household/support bubble.
- -Stay within your own county or 5km radius.
- -Hand sanitising is essential before and after the clean-up.
- -Use your own gloves, and don't share your litter picker if you're using one.
- -Make sure gloves/ litter pickers are clean before/after clean-up.
- -Do not collect any discarded PPE or tissue paper.
